Baked Goods Divisions

There will be no cookie, bar, or pie mixes accepted. Baked goods should be covered with clear, plastic wrap, or be in a plastic bag.

1. Breads: Whole loaves of light or dark yeast dough type
2. Buns: Four on a plate, hamburger, crescent, dinner rolls, Parker House, cloverleaf

3. Sweet Rolls: Three to four on a plate: cinnamon, frosted, orange, caramel pecan, tea ring, yeast coffee cake

4. Quick Breads: Whole loaf or four on a plate, baking powder biscuits, popovers, muffins, quick coffee cake, nut bread, fruit breads

5. Doughnuts: Four on a plate, raised doughnuts or cake doughnuts

6. Homemade Cakes: Four-inch square, no frosting; any type of cake, whole angel food or chiffon cake; cupcakes, 3-4 on a plate

7. Cake Mixes (Juniors only): Four-inch square of cake, or cupcakes with 3-4 on a plate, no frosting

8. Cookies: Four on a plate

9. Bars: Four two-inch squares on a plate, any kind; bring a recipe

10. Pies, Two-crust or one-crust pie only; no meringue

11. Candy: Six pieces on a plate, any and all kinds

12. Decorated items (judged on appearance and
